

#### Walton & Frinton 101st Annual Regatta August 2021

Racing was held over five days, conditions were challenging in new ways, the wind gods played ball, no drifters, all of us suffered a capsize at some point, Josh Reason had an epic fall from the saddle when he lost his mast during a heavy rain squall, Dave Reason is still carrying an unhealed flesh wound from his final day capsize in the gusty conditions. 


